What it means to be a Volunteer for Enrych

My reason for becoming a volunteer was that I felt that during my nursing career, disabled people where often on the margins, and still are to some degree today. I felt I wanted to make a difference, to recognise that each person is an individual with their needs and aspirations and that they need to be valued by society.

One of my first members, was a lady called Pamela. Following a stroke whilst in her 20s, she wanted to be able to swim. After discussions with the local swimming pool, who agreed for us to use the training pool, with me by her side, Pamela managed to swim and regained some strength. This encouraged her to move into supported living, find a job, and become independent and her own person again.

My present member is another Janet - we are known as the two J's. During our 27-year partnership we have grown old together. Janet now needs support from carers but we still meet up regularly and add to the many adventures we have shared - Sandbanks, Bournemouth, London, Stately Homes, numerus lunches, theatre, cinema, cream teas, garden centres, holidays to Blackpool and Ross-on-Wye etc. The challenge now is to find new places and things to do even though the pace of life is slower.

Any volunteer needs to develop a partnership with their member and assist them to facilitate their interests nothing is impossible with planning. In doing so, we enable our members to enjoy life and do things many of us take for granted.
